In the US, Wyoming, Montana and Colorado are plagued by wildfires even as they head in to winter. Even as they prepare for snow, the fires burn even hotter.

The ground is dry, the winds fierce, humidity is low, it's warm ... and the snow is late ... very late.

The Colorado state governor said, "We used to talk about a fire season, now it's a year-long phenomenon.

It is so dangerous to fight these fires; they are so big, so hot, they move at such a bewildering speed and the terrain is so rugged, that they don't really use firefighters at all ... only small planes with payloads of fire retardant on them. Many of the pilots of these planes have been killed, trying to save lives, buildings and the creation.
